1. WIP Format

Two Person four-ball match play for points
The two players on the team play their own ball. The better
ball of the two competes against the better ball of the
opponent for win of the hole (gross or net).

- 2. **Scoring**: Points will be awarded for one gross and one net point for each hole, with half points awarded for any halved holes. 36 points per match and 108 points possible per play day for each team.
- **3.** In the four-ball match, the lowest handicap player will play at scratch and each of the other three players in the group will receive the full difference in strokes as they fall on the score card.
- **4.** One designated team will enter scores on the Golf Genius app. Each team will keep a score card as a back up (Before starting put your pops and your opponents pops on your score card)
- **5.** Upon finishing your round, check your back up score card with the Golf Genius app
- 6. OGA will post the scores as Competition
- 7. To speed up play, if you are out of the hole pick up and write down the score you would most likely get or max equitable stroke score). If hole has been conceded pick up your ball, don't continue putting. If you are ready to play and your opponents are not, ask to go ahead and play.
- 8. Keep up with players ahead of you.
- 9. Wear Team colors red/black/white

Things to remember:

- -Player furthest from the hole plays first
- -Concede short putts.
- -Watch each other's ball flight
- -PICK UP WHEN YOU ARE OUT OF THE HOLE and write down the score you expect to get
- -Remember the 3 minute search rule for a lost ball
- Announce and play a provisional ball, when your ball might be lost outside a penalty area or out of bounds.
- -When players reach the green, it is a good idea to ask the other team how many strokes they have taken to this point. You may help to line up your partner's putt,
- -Golf Genius will also display a "popped" scorecard. Players are encouraged to keep their own written scorecard with these "pop"s (your team will have a golf genius code where you can find your pops)
- Players should agree on the official scores before they are saved. Any corrections need to be made before teeing off on the next hole.
