Handicap – Diane Meyers

Diane reviewed how an “exceptional score” affects our handicap. This information can be found in the USGA handicap rules.

Days Play/Scoring – Patti Book

- 477 members played golf in the month of May: 210 members on Tuesday, 190 members on Thursday and 77 members for the Scramble.
- Overall Day’s Play issues are beginning to smooth out. There are still some issues with recording scores on the wrong course and confusing player request on Tuesday.
- The Committee would like to give some pointers at the General Meeting for how to increase pace of play. They will be also asking players to record their start and finish time on their score card during a Tuesday and a Thursday in the month of June.
- The schedule was changed on Tuesday with more 18-hole groups going out first. Some 9-hole groups in between with more 18-hole groups. This seemed to help Tuesday and several members finished about the same time. Next week the tee times will begin at 8:04 AM and they hope the pro shop will continue with the early start time until fall. They do not have a commitment yet for Thursday earlier start times.
- A discussion was held regarding Tuesday play. 9-hole play has been outnumbering 18-hole play on Tuesdays. Patti talked with several members who play 9-holes on Tuesdays. Their response was that they prefer to play 9-holes on Tuesday and 18-holes on Thursday due to time restraints. Some play 9-holes both days due to aging. According to Chris Bensel, he is pleased to offer as many tee times as needed since this does not affect the golf club's profitability on Tuesdays.
- Joann Linville did state that CWGA has always been an 18-hole organization and that the 9-hole option started for those members who could no longer play 18 holes due to aging. Many 18-hole groups are unable to finish before the heat of the day around 2 PM. The restructured tee times seemed to help yesterday.

Rules- Joann Linville

- Joann asked for feedback regarding her Rules presentation at the last scramble. Only positive comments have come forward.
- Rules regarding double hits, drop zones, and relief from cart path are needed. It was suggested that we may go out on the course for the cart path rule as many are still confused even after the rule has been discussed.
- It would be nice if we could have the drop zone circles again. Joann has actually gone out on competition days and moved the drop zone marker so that it is easier to locate and play from. Red 8 is an issue.
